#### Re: Petition Regarding the Commercial Availability -Indigo Dyed Woven Fabric #2

Dear Mr. Chairman:

On behalf of B\*W\*A of New York City, we hereby submit this request for a finding of no commercial availability pursuant to the provisions of Section 203(0)(4) of the Dominican Republic-Central America-United States Free Trade Agreement ("DR-CAFTA") Implementation Act and your Federal Register notice of March 15, 2007, with respect to indigo-dyed woven fabric which B\*W\*A wishes to use in the manufacture of apparel in a DR-CAFTA member country. By means of this letter, we request that the subject fabric be added to Annex 3.25 of the Agreement.

The fabric in question is a 100% cotton lightweight fabric woven with a dobby attachment and piece dyed with synthetic indigo dye. It is classified in HTS 5208.39.8090. Further details are shown in the accompanying **Exhibit**.

In particular, the use of indigo piece dyeing cannot be substituted without altering the esthetic of the finished articles, including evenness of color from side to side and end to end.
